Abstract

This paper summarizes the journal's formatting guidelines. It is important to follow these guidelines in order to achieve a uniform appearance. The journal will not carry out editing of the papers. Some hints on how to write and submit papers are also explained.

1. Introduction

Paper size is A4 (210 x 297 mm) with upper margin of 3,5 cm., lower margin of 2,5 cm., and left and right margins of 2,3 cm.

1.1. First Page

The first page has special editing, and includes a heading with the paper's data. The title should be at 6 cm. from the upper border, centered, boldface and sized Times-16 pt. Two single-spaced lines below (sized Times-10), centered and sized Times-12, come the authors' names¹. One single-spaced line below (sized Times-10) come the authors' address and email. Lines should be single-spaced, centered, and sized Times-11.

Each paper must include an abstract, which appears three single-spaced lines (sized Times-10) below the last line in the title's heading. The abstract should be written with Times-10 font, justified, and single-spaced.

¹ *Types Times and Times New Roman are assumed equivalent.*

A list of keywords should be included two single-spaced lines (sized Times-10) after the abstract, with Times-10 font. Finally, the main text starts 2 cm. below the keywords.

2. Main Text

The paper should be written using Times-10 font, justified and single-spaced. Section headings are Times-12 boldface, and all other subsections (regardless of their level) are Times-10 boldface. There must be a double-spaced line between paragraphs, as well as a single-spaced line before and after every section or subsection title.

The text should be written in two columns, 7,5 cm. wide each, and separated 1,5 cm. from each other.

Figures should be centered and included in the text. If size requires, they may span through all the page's written width in a single column. In such cases, they should be placed at the top or bottom of the page. Figures should be separated from the text by at least 1,5 cm (approx. 3 single-spaced lines)

from surrounding text. Tables should follow a similar scheme. Figure and table captions should be centered, boldface, and use Times-10 font.

Page numbers and formatted headings and footings are not necessary in drafts submitted for review. The paper may include footnotes using italic Times 9pt. font.

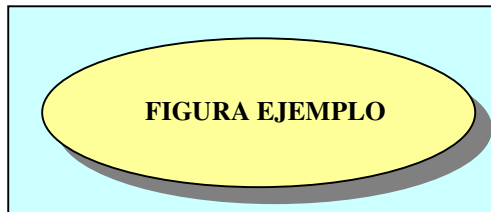


Figure 1. Simple Figure

It is important to save space at the bottom of the first page for the formatted footing that includes page numbering, volume, number and year. This data are provided by the editors to all accepted papers, and should be included in proof and camera-ready papers. These data should be included in italic Times-8 font.

3. Submitting your Paper

Paper submission should be carried out through the journal's Web page <http://www.aepia.org/revista/revista.html>. Click on the link to the electronic version and follow the author's guidelines.

Following this process the author implicitly transfers copyright of accepted papers to AEPIA, accepting their publication electronically (freely available through the Journal's Web pages) and in printed volumes.

4. Formatting References

References should be clear and complete, preferably citing already published material. Sample references are these [1] [2] and this one [3]. See below the format of references.
